

# Easter Holiday Activities 😊



1. **Have an egg and spoon race!** Hard boil enough eggs for each member of your family. Decorate the eggs with paint, stickers, feathers... what ever you can find. Set out a race course and ready, set, RACE!

2. **Make Easter nests:** Recipe attached.

3. **Make an Easter garland.** Cut card / paper into an Easter egg shape. Decorate each egg, hole punch and then thread onto a piece of string or similar.



4. **Make Easter cards to post to family and friends.**



5. **Play pin the tail on the bunny!** Printouts attached.



6. **Make Easter masks.** Using paper plates, cut out holes for eyes. Hole punch each side of the plate to thread through elastic (or similar). Alternatively you can attach to a wooden spoon or similar and hold the mask instead. Use another plate to create either a beak for a chick or bunny ears. Paint and decorate!

# Chocolate Easter Egg Nest Cakes


## Ingredients

- 225g/8oz plain chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 50g/2oz butter
- 75g/2¾oz cornflakes
- 36 mini chocolate eggs

## Method

1. Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.
2. Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.
3. Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.
4. Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.
